<b><u>Accomplishments:</u></b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Conducting training programme for 20 community leaders and 20 youth leaders on eco-tourism, water quality monitoring and local tourist guidance</li> <li>• Formulating plans and committee for eco-tourism</li> <li>• Conducting training on alternative occupation</li> <li>• Establishing a village fund to support the solution process for local environment</li> </ul>
<b><u>Needs:</u></b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Identifiable members capable of putting what is learnt into practice</li> <li>• Emergence of the fund</li> </ul>

<p><b><u>Location:</u></b></p>	<p>WARED: <b>Wild Animal Rescue and Education Center</b> (The Wild Animal Rescue Foundation of Thailand)</p>
<p><b><u>Accomplishments:</u></b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Plant 1,000 coastal trees on 30th April, to be complete 2005</li> <li>• Plant 1,450 mangrove trees, completed March 2005</li> <li>• Rubbish collected amounting to approximately 450 kg January-February 2005</li> </ul>
<p><b><u>Needs:</u></b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Plant more than 1,000 coastal trees</li> <li>• Take care of the plant's growth</li> </ul>
<p><b><u>Status/Progress:</u></b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Ongoing research of mangrove and coastal forest ecology</li> <li>• Promote forest conservation and maintain a balance within nature of ecological systems essential to the survival of wild animals.</li> <li>• Continue rubbish collecting</li> </ul>
